

## CONSTITUTION OF THE D.U. YOGA SOCIETY

### Article 1

The name of the society will be the Dublin University Yoga Society.

### Article 2

The aims of the society shall be the physical, mental and spiritual development of the individual in accordance with the principles of yoga. These aims are hoped to be achieved through

- (a) The study, teaching and practice of the philosophy of yoga.
- (b) The initiation and support of social, artistic and scientific projects which are harmonious with the above mentioned aims.

### Article 3

Membership of the society is open to all staff and capitated students of T.C.D.

### Article 4

The Officers of the society shall be

- (a) Chairperson
- (b) Treasurer
- (c) Secretary

### Article 5

- (a) All officers and two members of the society shall be elected at the A.G.M. to form the committee for the society.
- (b) The A.G.M. shall be held at the end of Hilary Term.
- (c) All officers of the committee shall hold office for one year.
- (d) If for some particular reason any officer is unable to continue with her/his post, a replacement may be elected as soon as it is convenient to hold a general meeting for that purpose.
- (e) The committee will be responsible for the administration of the society.
- (f) A meeting of the committee will take place at least once every month during term.
- (g) The quorum for a committee meeting will be four.

### Article 6

The business of the A.G.M. shall be

- (a) To discuss the reports of relevant officers.
- (b) To vote on the adoption of the above mentioned reports.
- (c) To elect officers and a committee for the coming year.
- (d) To plan a programme for the coming year.
- (e) To discuss any other motions which come before the meeting.

### Article 7

No change may be made in this constitution except at the A.G.M. or at a general meeting summoned especially for that purpose. Fourteen days' notice of proposed amendments must be given before such a meeting will occur. A proposal to amend the constitution shall not be deemed to have been passed unless the said (personnel) proposal has the support of at least two thirds of the ordinary members of the society who are present and voting.
